## **July 2, 2021**

The City Council approved Mayor Jacob Frey's \$102 million spending plan for the first round of American Rescue Plan Act funding.

#### March 24, 2022 The City Council

approved rolling over appropriations from 2021 into 2022 for programs that were making progress and meeting milestones toward completion. Approximately \$8 million of Phase 1 projects were discontinued, making that funding available for repurposing in Phase 2.

All ARPA spending must be wrapped up according to current U.S. Treasury Guidelines.

# September-November 2021

The City Council approved a handful of additional ARPA appropriations totaling \$11 million for time sensitive proposals.
